The Temple Symphony Orchestra will bring a variety of beautiful sounds for "A Chamber Music Montage" at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, March 6, at the Mary Alice Marshall Performing Arts Center at Temple College. TSO under the baton of maestro Tom Fairlie will join special guest pianist Shari Santorelli and members of TSO string, wind and percussion sections for the next to the last concert in the symphony's season.

Individual tickets cost \$20 for adults and \$5 for students. They will be sold at the door and are available in advance at www.TempleSymphony.org, Temple College, the Cultural Activities Center at 3011 N. Third St. in Temple, Von Music, and the Marketing Department at Scott & White. Active duty military personnel and their dependents are admitted free of charge.

The concert will include Johannes Brahms' Piano Trio No. 3 in C Minor, op. 101; a Haydn string quartet orchestrated for percussion ensemble; and Claude Bowling's Suite No. 2 for Flute and Jazz Piano.

Ms. Santorelli is an adjunct piano instructor at Midland College, has performed as soloist and collaborative pianist in the United States, Mexico and Europe. She received a bachelor's degree in performance from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N.Y; a master's of music in performance and literature from the University of Louisville in Louisville, Ky.; and training at the American Institute of Musical Studies in Graz, Austria.

Ms. Santorelli is principal keyboard with the Midland Odessa Symphony Chorale and is on the faculty of the Trinity School of Midland. She has been a featured artist at the Texas Music Teachers Association and Texas Music Educator Association conventions, and has participated in chamber music series held at

Temple College, Texas Tech University, Lubbock Christian University, among others, and has been presented with numerous chamber and chorale groups throughout the region.

In Mexico, Ms. Santorelli performed as member of the Guadalajara Piano Trio. She has performed concertos with orchestras in Guadalajara, Midland, and Pittsburgh. Her recordings include a CD with Javier Pinell of Bolivian violin and piano selections, and the Lone Star Brass Christmas CD.

She is a nationally certified member of the Music Teachers National Association, the Texas Music Teachers Association and the Midland Music Teachers Association. She has had students who have participated and been honored with winning scores at state competitions.

TSO's final concert of the 2009-2010 season will be May 1. An injury to the originally scheduled guest artist has necessitated a schedule change. Mr. John Fairlie, bassoonist, will join the orchestra for the finale concert, while Ms. Frances Renzi will reschedule her performance with the TSO for May, 2011.
